Matthew 8

Jesus' Amazing Miracles; and What Amazed Jesus

Miracles recorded in Chapter 8:

- The man with Leprosy
- The servant of the Centurion
- The mother-in-law of Peter
- Demon possessed and...
- Many who were sick (brought to Peter's house)
- · Calms the storm on the Sea of Galilee
- The two violent, demon-possessed men, sending the spirits into the herd of pigs who then went over a cliff

1st- The man who amazed Jesus: Matt 8:5-11

Luke 7 fills in a few interesting, insightful details:

It was actually "some Elders of the Jews" who came.
These were respected Elders from Capernaum who held the Centurion in high regard.

When they came to Jesus, they **pleaded earnestly** with him, "This man deserves to have you do this, 5 because he loves our nation and has built our synagogue."

- Before Jesus arrives the Centurion "sent friends..."
- The Centurion actually did not speak directly with Jesus because "I do not deserve to have you come under my roof..." and I did not even consider myself worthy to come to you..."
- The Centurion's servant is called a "doulos" or slave in vs. 2 but in vs. 7 he's called a "mou pias," =my boy or valued youth. Notice he is referred to as valued highly (dear, honored, of great worth-beyond money)

Key words which help us understand this story better:

Centurion: A military officer who oversees 100 other soldiers. Closest leaders oversaw 10 and 1000. Reported to Herod Antipas.

Amazed: Wondered, marveled, admiration, astonished. The only other time Jesus is amazed is at the lack of faith among those from His hometown, Nazareth. (Mark 6:6)

In between the two stories Jesus focuses on the fact that there is a great cost when we follow Jesus. (8:14-17)

2nd- The disciples are amazed: 8:23-27

Mark 4:35-41 adds some insight:

- Other boats were with them
- Traveled from north to south end of the lake
- Jesus was in the stern (back) under a seat, with his head resting on a "pillow" which was a heavy ballast bag used as a counterweight when pulling in nets
- "Don't you care if we drown?"
- "They were terrified..."

"What kind of man is this, even the winds and waves obey him!"

3rd- Healing two demon-possessed men: 8:28-34

"What do you want with us, Son of God?" they shouted. "Have you come here to torture us before the appointed time?" 8:29

You believe that there is one God. Good! Even the demons believe that — and shudder. James 2:19

Jesus asked him, "What is your name?" "Legion," he replied, because many demons had gone into him. Luke 8:30 Jesus allows the demons to enter the 2,000 pigs nearby (Mark 5:13)

Questions:

- 1. The story of the Centurion, who is a leader with great authority and influence, is really one of faith and humility. How do these two attributes work together?
- 2. Jesus can work miracles but is our faith and trust based on whether or not He does them for us or those we care about? Study Matthew 8-9.
