Big Kingdom Questions: How? and When? "For I tell you, you will not see me again, until you say, 'Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord."

Matthew 23:39

Jesus had just pronounced righteous judgment against the scribes and Pharisees who misled the Jews in their worship life. Now, his prophecy of the destruction of the temple in Jerusalem caused his disciples to inquire when and how all of the things might take place that signal his coming again.
