Midweek Lenten Services

Elders Review Health Policy

The King of Kings Lutheran Church Covid-19 Health Policy will be reviewed by the Board of Elders on March 1 to determine if a partial relaxation of the congregation's mask-wearing policy may occur. Iowa Governor Kim Reynolds recently announced a statewide lifting of mask requirements in public spaces while some city and county mask requirements remain in place along with a continuation of social distancing and other protective measures.

The Board of Elders desires to provide worship opportunities as close to "normal" as soon as reasonably possible, based on the prevalence of the Covid-19 virus in our community. A likely first step would be to designate one Sunday worship service as "masks optional." All current mask requirements would remain in place.

We are aware that there is a wide range of opinions and very, very strong feelings associated with this issue. Thus, we are eager to have members let us know their thoughts about the possibility of opening the 10:45 service to those who choose not to wear masks.

To be clear, no other changes are contemplated at this point. Sunday School, Youth, Adult Bible Study classes will still require mask use. In addition, all transitions within our building on Sunday mornings would require mask use, including entering and exiting and exiting the sanctuary. Worshipers not wanting to wear masks would be asked to remove them only when seated and put them back on when they leave their seats.

King of Kings established its health protection policies based on CDC recommendations, guidance from local health departments, practices adopted by school districts and actions of fellow congregations.

We are blessed that within our local area the incidence of Covid-19 has diminished markedly since peaking last fall. We pray that our actions as a congregation do not hamper the progress that has been made to date. Therefore, we seek your prayerful consideration and input on this subject.
