Welcome to Nineveh

"Jesus came into Galilee, proclaiming the gospel of God, and saying, "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God is at hand; _____ and _____ in the gospel." (Mark 1:14-15)

Jesus called Simon, Andrew, James and John and they followed.

God called Jonah and he fled.

Jonah's personal prejudice caused him to reject God's will. He preferred that God

_____ the "bad people" rather than _____ and _____ them. But the Ninevites heard God's message and repented.

"Let everyone turn from his evil way and from the violence that is in his hands. Who knows? God may turn and relent and turn from his fierce anger, so that we may not perish." (Jonah 3:8-9)

Christians are to recognize prejudices and divisions for what they are: remnants of a dying world.

"Let those who deal with the world live as though they had no dealings with it. For the present form of this world is _____." (1 Corinthians 7:31)

Americans' increasing levels of anxiety are evidence that the gospel is needed more than ever to bring about repentance and faith.

62% - more anxious than one year ago

51% - political discussion cause moderate or extreme anxiety

"I want you to be free from _____." "I say this...to promote good order and to secure your _____ to the Lord." (1 Corinthians 7:32, 35)
