1. Jesus prayed early and often (It was His PRIORITY)

Very early in the morning, while it was still dark, Jesus got up, left the house and went off to a solitary place, where he prayed. Mark 1:35

But Jesus often withdrew to lonely places and prayed. Luke 5:16

2. Jesus prayed when he needed help -Phil. 2:6-7 "...He gave up his divine privileges..." Remember, Satan "will never stop attacking us!" Luther Remember Jesus in the Garden before His suffering on the cross. Luke 22

3. Jesus prayed for direction from God, the Father (see Luke 6:12)

4. Jesus prayed because prayer changes the world

James, the brother of Jesus says, "*Therefore confess your sins to each other and pray for each other so that you may be healed. The prayer of a righteous person is powerful and effective.*"

James 5:16
