Introduction: What do you do with sin?

Ignore it, deny it, cover it up, minimize it, carry it around with you, manage it yourself, justify it-_____ for it.

And he (God) said, "Who told you that you were naked? Have you eaten from the tree that I commanded you not to eat from? 12 The man said, "The woman you put here with me – she gave me some fruit from the tree, and I ate it..." The woman said, "The serpent deceived me, and I ate." Gen 3:11-13

Being clear of what it means to CONFESS: Admit, acknowledge, own up, plead guilty, make a break, come clean; fess up. Dictionary definition: "A formal statement admitting one is guilty of a crime."

Personally coming to God in order to _____ the sin really is a sin and _____ it to God.

What to do with sin

Against you, you only, have I sinned and done what is evil in your sight...
Psalm 51:4 Sin is ultimately between you and God!

Remember Peter after he denied Jesus the 3rd time (contrition, to be truly, deeply _____)

*The Lord turned and looked straight at Peter. Then Peter remembered ... 62 And he went outside and wept **bitterly**.* Luke 22:61-62

The Danger of Denying sin-Spiritual, emotion, mental self deception!
8 If we claim to be without sin, we deceive ourselves and the truth is not in 10... we make him out to be a liar and his word has no place in our lives.

Real Freedom

Aid for Ukraine Lutheran Church

The Evangelical Lutheran Church of Ukraine is working to aid those affected by the war that has come to that nation. The Lutheran Church Missouri Synod is currently working with five partner churches to help refugees from this conflict. These church bodies are located in Latvia, Lithuania, Romania, Germany and the Czech Republic.

In Ukraine, Rev. Serge Maschewski, bishop of the ELCU, requested funds for medicine; fuel for the evacuation of children, women and the elderly; food; and personal safety gear for pastors who work in dangerous areas.

"Today we need food. Tomorrow we need medicine. The list changes daily," Maschewski said.
