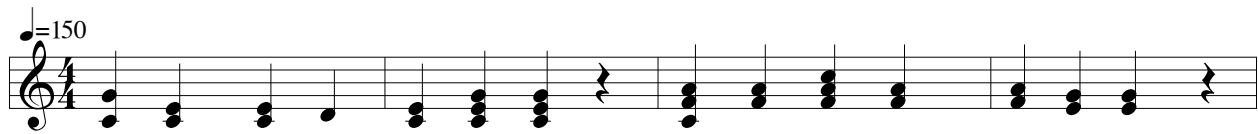
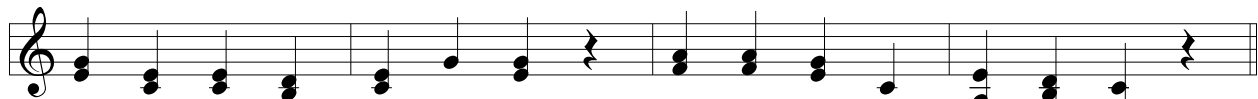


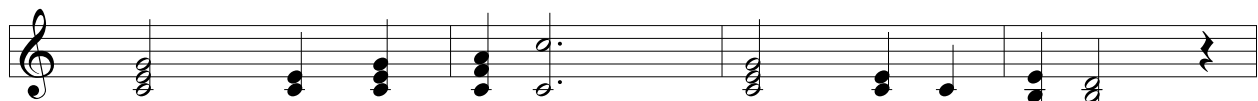
Sing Glory, Glory
