Follow Jesus

Sanctification #1: Stepping up, with the power of the Holy Spirit working in us, into the _____ that we have from Jesus.

A sanctified, holy life—one lived in God's forgiveness—seeks from God and not from the world.

The Example of Simon, called to be a disciple of Jesus:

[Andrew] "brought Simon to Jesus. Jesus looked at him and said. 'So you are Simon the son of John? You shall be called Cephas' (which means Peter)." John 1:42

Jesus changed the name by which Simon would be known (Peter = Rock), and he would change him even more than that.

From: "I do not know the man..."

"God has made him both and this Jesus whom you crucified."

Peter was able to live up to his name as he was led by the Holy Spirit in faith.

God has renamed you also by giving you his own name.

Sanctification #2: To live according to the name received in your baptism-Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Sanctification (holiness) is the daily living of a disciple—a follower, imitator—of Jesus.

"Whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thank to God the Father through Him." Colossians 3:17

RESURRECTION. THEN WHAT? A Short Bible Study of Our Future Hope in Christ

Following the Easter celebration of Jesus' resurrection from the dead, it is fitting to conduct a biblical study of our own future bodily resurrection to be with him, as well as our future life, both preceding and subsequent to that resurrection.

The seminal words in Scripture, that describe the hope of God's believing people, are Job's four statements of certainty in Job 19:25-26. "I know that my Redeemer lives;" "and at the last he will stand upon the earth:" "and after my skin has been thus destroyed;" "yet in my flesh I shall see God, whom I shall see for myself, and my eyes shall behold, and not another." Job then adds. "My heart faints within me." Paul writes that if we do not have this hope, then "we are of all people most to be pitied."

Using Job's statements as a structure, beginning Sunday April 24 and continuing through May 22, Ken and Marsha McElreath will lead a study of biblical teachings that speak to this hope. We will discuss the many relevant passages and, by God's Spirit, form a more sure future hope in Christ, who has become the "firstborn from the dead."

The study will be held in the Heartland room at 7:50, with community discussion over coffee to follow at 9:30. All are invited.
