

Put Your Knowledge to Work for Kids

The Marion Ministry and Outreach Center is planning several activities this spring and summer to connect with students and their families in Marion. These activities will use subjects related to Science, Technology, Engineering and Math to develop relationships with families. These relationships offer opportunities to share our faith in Jesus in words and actions.

Several volunteers are needed to lead and assist with each one-day learning and fellowship event. Materials and instructions will be provided for each activity. Please consider how your life experience may support young people in this way. Here are the currently-planned activities, provided with the assistance of Iowa State University Extension and Outreach:

Bubbles and Balloons: This activity combines science and fun using bubbles and balloons to explore physics. Simple experiments provide interesting insights into the physical world. (K -12) **Application**: the beauty and designed complexity of God's creation. (Lead and 3 assistants needed)

Crime and Spy Science: Explore crime and spy science through hands-on activities like fingerprint dusting, decoding messages, and collecting evidence. (4-12) **Application**: God has a unique plan and desire for my life as his child, and it isn't a secret. The answers are found in his Word, the Bible. (Lead and 3 assistants needed)

Bridge Building: This introduction to engineering helps kids develop abilities of technological design by engineering a structure to meet specific need using simple materials. The unit utilizes Knex pieces to build a truss bridge large enough for students to crawl across. (3-6) **Application:** Jesus is the bridge from "Lost" to "Saved." (Mike Frerking, Lead; 3 assistants needed)

Circuits, Circuits: Kids learn the basics of circuits and electricity using various snap circuits, squishy circuits, paper circuits and other materials. (4-12) **Application:** God works in our lives, unseen yet real. We see his work flowing through the people and events around us. (Dan Henry, Lead; 3 assistants needed)
