Building Update: The interior portion is getting close. We are working on a long list of lots of little things. Towel FORWARD dispensers are up. Counters are all installed but a few sinks remain to be finished. A few pieces of door window glass are waiting. A few misc. electrical items, etc. Flooring is complete except for carpet, that is the last interior piece and

we are aiming for early July to finish that. A majority of the furniture and interior items have all been ordered and due mid Summer. The focus is turning to exterior items. The big item there is the pump house which will be going up in the next few weeks. Pump installation after that. Grading for the patio and playground is scheduled for mid to later June. Retaining walls can then be built. The big dirt piles require bigger equipment and that is scheduled to be done in mid July. We will need help this week getting the 4 and 6" drain tiles from the down spouts buried so those areas are ready for the finish grading. Finish landscaping including seeding and plants will be done this fall. Feel free to have a look around.
