Call Committee Update 2022-06-23

The Call Committee has been busy:

- 1. We received a total of 21 nominations from the congregation.
- 2. We researched all 21 candidates and narrowed the list to 12. We requested 12 profiles from the Iowa District East (IDE).
- 3. We received 8 profiles back from IDE, plus 1 more candidate profile suggested by President Saunders (9 total). The remaining four candidates were not available for consideration (due to recent installations, etc.).
- 4. We evaluated all 9 profiles and identified 6 excellent candidates.
- 5. All 6 were contacted via email to ask them directly if they are able to consider a Call at this time:
 - a. 3 said that they are not able to consider a Call at this time, for various reasons.
- b. 3 said they are not actively looking, but are able to consider a Call.
- 6. We conducted a Zoom interview with one candidate on 6/14 and liked him.
- 7. When we tried to set up a Zoom interview with the second candidate, he informed us that after talking with his District President and praying about it, he has decided to withdraw his name from consideration. We were disappointed because he is an excellent candidate, but we trust the Lord to lead us in the direction we need to go.
- 8. We are in the process of setting up a Zoom interview with the third candidate. The reason he is later than the other candidates is because he just got back from a two week vacation and is traveling this week for his District convention. Based on his availability and Call Committee, we are trying for the week of July 5-8 for the interview.
- 9. We will then invite the approved candidate(s) for a visit to King of Kings (hopefully some time in July), where they will meet with the Call Committee, Governing Board, Staff, and Board of Elders.
- 10. Provided the Spirit leads us in that direction, our goal is to have a Voters' Meeting to Call our new Senior Pastor no later than early August. If we do not have at least two candidates, we will have to start our search again to find additional candidates.
- 11. Vacancy Pastor: Pastor Weinold has agreed to meet with our Board of Elders to define his role for Vacancy Pastor, if we indeed have a vacancy before we install our new Senior Pastor.
- 12. Organizational note: Petra Wiezorek has resigned from the Call Committee. She and her husband have decided to transfer to another church. We don't plan to add another member to the Call Committee at this time (we still have 6 members; Dan Henry, Bob Freymark, Deanna Glass, Jessica Dvorak, David Hoffman and Shane Hartzler), but if the search is restarted, we will consider adding another member.
