

Good Friday Tenebrae Service Friday, April 7, 2023

+ Introductory Remarks +

The word "Tenebrae" means darkness. This service reminds us that we deserve to live in darkness, without God, and that Christ went in to that darkness for us and brought us light. The service begins in silence and ends in silence and darkness. The gradual darkening of the worship center lights and the extinguishing of the candles during the service signifies the going out of our Lord's life.

The "strepitas" or slamming closed of the Bible also signifies the "finishing" of our Lord's task of salvation. At the close of the service, the congregation shall refrain from greeting each other and leave in silence and darkness. You may place your offering in one of the plates by the door as you leave.

Let us now remember the first "Good Friday" – Jesus tried, condemned, and nailed to the cross, darkness covering the earth, Jesus yielding up His spirit and dying ... His Body placed in a tomb ... and the stone sealed.
