Introduction: Truth, Knowledge and Gnosticism

1 John 5:13 I write these things...so that you may know that you have eternal life.

John uses the word “_____” (35 times) and true (30 times) for good reason. Gnosticism= “I know a deeper _____; a secret, hidden truth with superior meaning.”

And we are in him who is true — even in his Son Jesus Christ. He is the true God and eternal life. 1 John 5:19-20

21 Dear children, keep yourselves from _____.

Today's version of idolatrous Gnosticism, “We live in a culture that credits _____ with developing better truth, when, in fact, science can only detect preexisting truths.”

Science did not create nor invent: The Periodic Table of Elements; The four Laws of Thermodynamics; Newton's Laws of Motion in Physics or the Law of Universal Gravitation; E=mc² nor DNA

Without the gift of Holy Spirit given faith God and ultimate truth cannot be understood: *People who do not have God's Spirit do not accept the things that come from his Spirit. They think these things are foolish. They cannot understand them, because they can only be understood with the Spirit's help. 1 Cor 2:14-15, Easy-to-Read Version AND Now faith is the assurance of things hoped for, the conviction of things not seen...3 By faith we understand that the universe was created by the word of God, so that what is seen was not made out of things that are visible. Heb 11:2-3*

Here is How faith works: We have not received the spirit of the world but the Spirit who is from God, that we may _____ what God has freely given us. 1 Cor 2:12-13 (see 1 John 3:21 again and Galatians 2:20-21)
